Course Description

Chinese 7 is a beginning course for Chinese language and culture study. Students will use Chinese Pinyin system to learn how to combine the finals, initials, and tone marks to make proper Chinese spellings and sounds. Students will also learn Chinese character components, and grammatical structures. The focus of the Chinese 7 class is to guide students in developing their communicative competence in the four basic skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing, as well as gaining an understanding of Chinese culture. Through the course of Chinese 7, students will be able to connect with Chinese culture, start building a global mindset and love for foreign languages.

Class Procedures

- Arrive on time and be ready to work when class begins. **Tardy will be counted.**
- Chinese traditional classroom etiquettes will be practiced at the beginning and the end of class.
- A class monitor will be on duty every week to collect homework/classwork and lead Chinese traditional classroom etiquettes.
- Use Chinese classroom expressions once they are taught.
- Food/drink are allowed only during the **first FIVE minutes** of class.
- Water is allowed with notification. But **NO CHEWING GUM.**
- **No cellphones** during class, only iPads with permission .
- Put away other subjects' materials and textbooks **DURING THE CLASS.**
- Have all needed supplies ready for class.

Homework and Make-ups

Homework assignments are a great opportunity to practice, reflect and review.

- Homework need to be submitted before class starts on the DUE date.

- Late homework will be counted **80%** of the grade. Missing homework are graded as 0 until the make-up work is submitted within the grading period.
- Make arrangement before absences.
Chinese 7 is a high-school level course. HSCM students follow the high-school level homework policy. School policy allows **TWO days** for make-up work to be completed for each day a student is absent. In case of extenuating circumstances, more time can be given.

Testing and Quizzes

- Quizzes will be given **each Friday** except the first and the last week of the semester and any other school scheduled changes.
- Cheating will not be tolerated.
- It is student's responsibility to make up all the quizzes, tests and projects.
- Students can have **FIVE school days** to make up their tests and quizzes. Failure to abide the rule will receive grade of 0. In case of extenuating circumstances, more time can be given.
